

What is Harvest for Hunger?

Harvest for Hunger is one of the largest food and funds drives in the United States. In 2018, more than \$5.2 million and nearly 700,000 pounds of food were collected, helping to provide more than 22 million meals to hungry men, women and children in 21 counties. Harvest for Hunger is a collaborative effort of four area food banks serving hungry families, children and seniors in Northeast and North Central Ohio.

Who does Harvest for Hunger help?

The Greater Cleveland Food Bank provides services in six counties, including Cuyahoga, Ashland, Ashtabula, Geauga, Lake and Richland. More than 44% of the people served are children and seniors, 23% have at least one person living in their home who is in poor health, and 64% of these households must choose between paying for food and paying for utilities.

Food and funds donated to the Greater Cleveland Food Bank through the Harvest for Hunger campaign are distributed to more than 900 local hunger centers and program partners throughout our six-county service area.

How can I help?

We're so glad you asked! You can host a food and funds drive at your school, business, or organization. All proceeds from your drive help feed families and individuals in our six-county service area. While we gladly accept food donations, we encourage you to raise funds in lieu of food due to the Food Bank's incredible purchasing power. For every dollar donated, the Food Bank can help provide four nutritious meals for our neighbors in need.

Together, we are working to ensure that everyone in our communities has the nutritious food they need every day.

AWARD RECOGNITION LEVELS

EMERALD

Total Giving **\$50,000 and above**
Per Capita **\$100 and above per employee**

PLATINUM

Total Giving **\$20,000 – \$49,999**
Per Capita **\$60 – \$99 per employee**

GOLD

Total Giving **\$15,000 – \$19,999**
Per Capita **\$50 – \$59 per employee**

SILVER

Total Giving **\$10,000 – \$14,999**
Per Capita **\$40 – \$49 per employee**

BRONZE

Total Giving **\$5,000 – \$9,999**
Per Capita **\$30 – \$39 per employee**

SPECIAL AWARDS

In addition to the recognition levels listed above, there are special awards each year presented to two deserving organizations. **The Bag of Hope** and **The Edmond V. Worley** awards are presented to companies that demonstrate an unparalleled commitment to Harvest for Hunger. Companies are considered for these awards based on the participation of employees in their internal drive, creativity of the coordinator and company's efforts, and overall enthusiasm and support for local hunger relief efforts. The Bag of Hope award is presented to an organization with 250 employees or more, and the Edmond V. Worley award is awarded to an organization with fewer than 250 employees.

You must submit your contribution report by May 24, 2019 in order to be eligible to receive an award.

WRAPPING UP: 4 EASY STEPS



► STEP 1: COMPLETE THE HARVEST FOR HUNGER CONTRIBUTION REPORT

Go to GreaterClevelandFoodBank.org/HFH to access the Harvest for Hunger contribution report. Please submit this report in person, online, or through the mail as described on the form.

You must submit the report no later than **MAY 24, 2019** so that your gift is included in the campaign total and you are appropriately acknowledged at our recognition ceremony.

► STEP 2: COMPILE YOUR DONOR LIST

All donors will receive a personalized thank you letter. Please provide us with a list of your cash donors, their donation amounts and their contact information on the Cash Donor Report, available online. Simply visit GreaterClevelandFoodBank.org/HFH to view all electronic campaign materials. You can open and print the “Cash Donor Report” from this section. You need not list any donors who made their contribution with a personal check.
